Conferences/Courses

REQUIRED

At any stage of training:

- Up to 2 of the following courses: **EMST** course or **APLS** course or **ELS** course
- 2 ACEM **Pre Approved** University papers which may include Clinical Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Research Methods or Evidence Based Medicine - for those trainees not doing a research project
- Auckland Regional Ultrasound Course
- Day 2 of the NZ Anaesthesia Part 0 Course (NZ)

Basic Trainees reimbursed for:

- Any Australasian Primary Examination course in preparation for Primary exam
- Basic ICU Course (Hawkes Bay)

Advanced Trainees reimbursed for:

- 4.10 presentation at approved conference (requires a letter of support from Director of Training)
- Difficult Airway Course
- Teamwork – Training and Education in Emergency Medicine (Research Course to assist with 4.10 projects)
- The NZ Pre-Fellowship Examination Course,

OR

- An equivalent Pre-Fellowship Examination Course in preparation for the ACEM Fellowship exam

Advanced Trainees defined as senior registrars under the MECA may access their Senior Registrar Entitlement to be reimbursed for the following:

- Other relevant conferences to EM training. A letter of suitability of the conference will be required by the VTC. Reimbursement will be up to the limit of the current RDA MECA.

Medical Education Allocation at Middlemore ED:

- Those trainees that are allocated to this position will be reimbursed for the Post Graduate Clinical Education Course at Auckland University (Confirmation letter from service required)
